

#### History of Civil Registration in Yemen

- In the 1980s there were various, mostly UN financed Civil Register projects in both parts of Yemen
- In 1991 the first Law for Civil Registration in the unified Yemen was established
- The law was amended in 2003
- In 2008 / 2009 the Civil Register issue as a key priority for future development was defined
- Corresponding activities were started


#### Main reporting lines and their problems




#### **Registration level by Governate** based on calculations of 2006 data by UNICEF



## Main functions of governmental personal data registers




## **Types of personal data registers**

Support from the UAE for ID card project, including co-financing agreement




Based on Civil Register information but more information requiered

Intention to join Civil and voter register in one unique register Consulting r webbe Results


## Data for the Population Register Database (general data)




## **Proposal for action-plan**

- Link between the governmental databases


#### **Databases and joining process**

# How to close the existing registration gap?

#### **Direct activities**

- Easy access to registration (location and modalities)
- Data-exchange between governmental institutions
- Changing budgeting for local areas gradually according to the registered number of residents
- Generating the legal need to be registered (legislation)

#### **Indirect activities**

- Campaigns for registration with CSOs and Mosques
- Awareness campaigns in schools and in media
