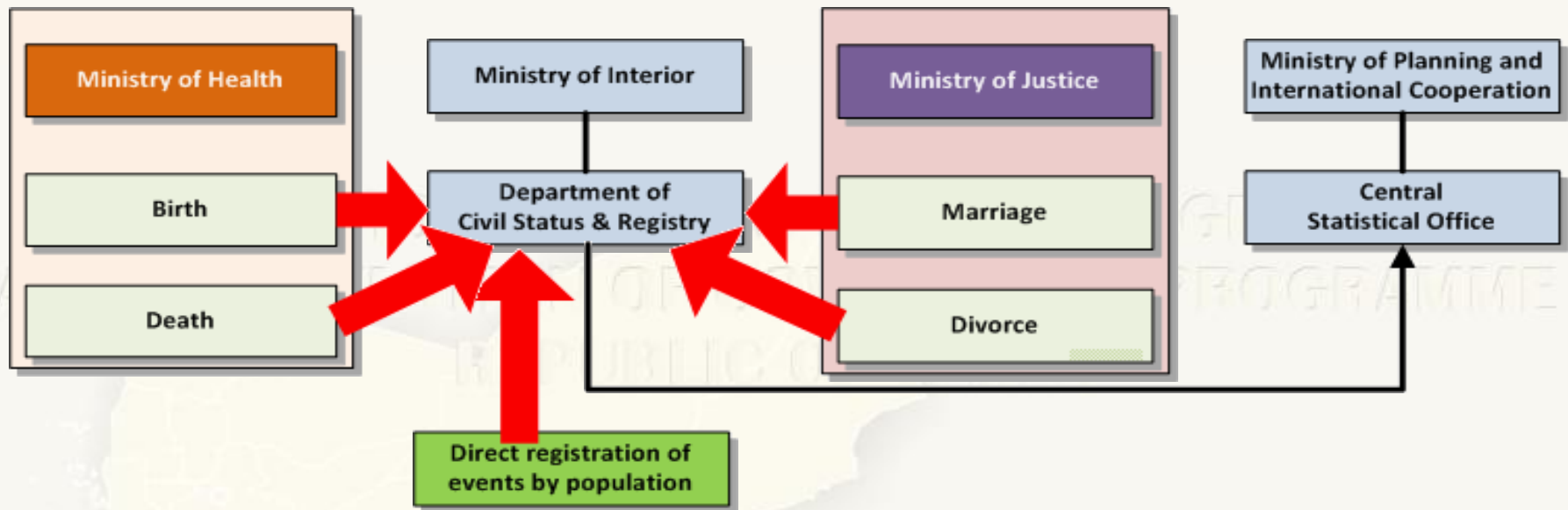

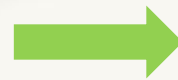
History of Civil Registration in Yemen

- In the 1980s there were various, mostly UN financed Civil Register projects in both parts of Yemen
- In 1991 the first Law for Civil Registration in the unified Yemen was established
- The law was amended in 2003
- In 2008 / 2009 the Civil Register issue as a key priority for future development was defined
- Corresponding activities were started

Main reporting lines and their problems



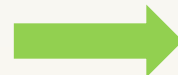
Ministry of Health reports birth and death events

Mostly not usual – lack of awareness

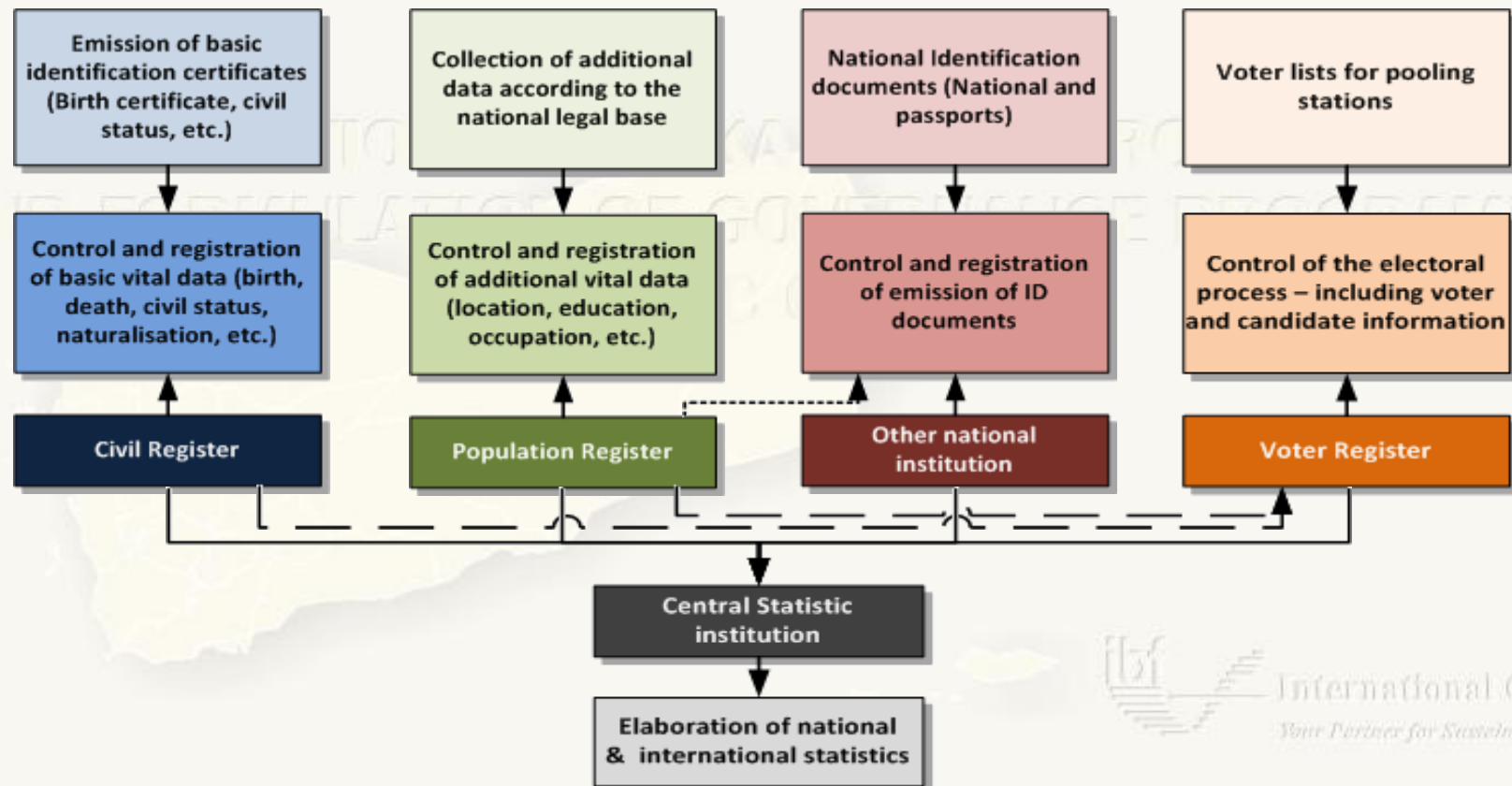

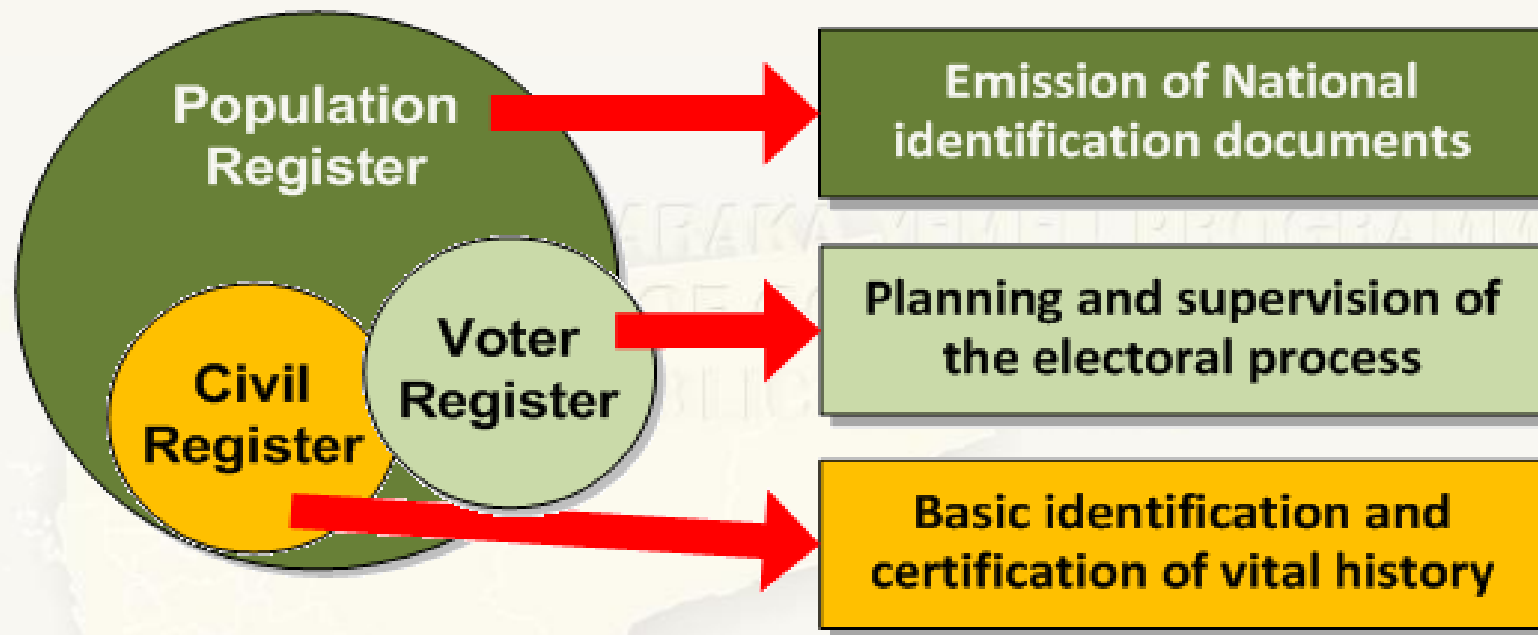
Registration level by Governate based on calculations of 2006 data by UNICEF



Main functions of governmental personal data registers



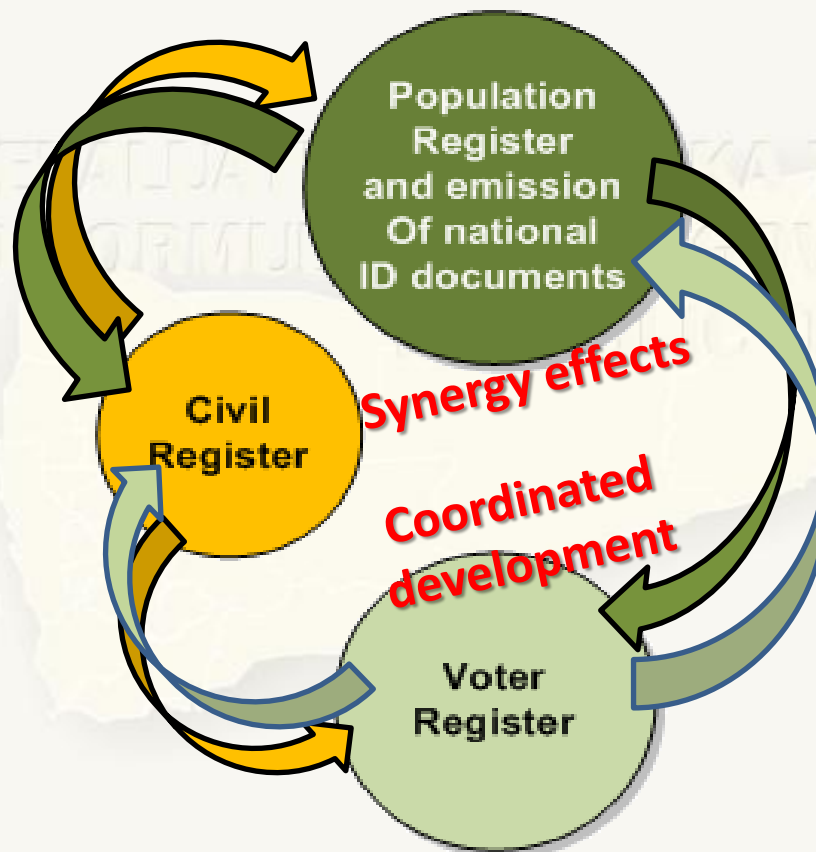
Types of personal data registers



It is required to verify the national legal base to include the voter register. In some countries this is against the law.

Emission of national ID and passports since 2007 - Gemalto

Support from the UAE for ID card project, including co-financing agreement

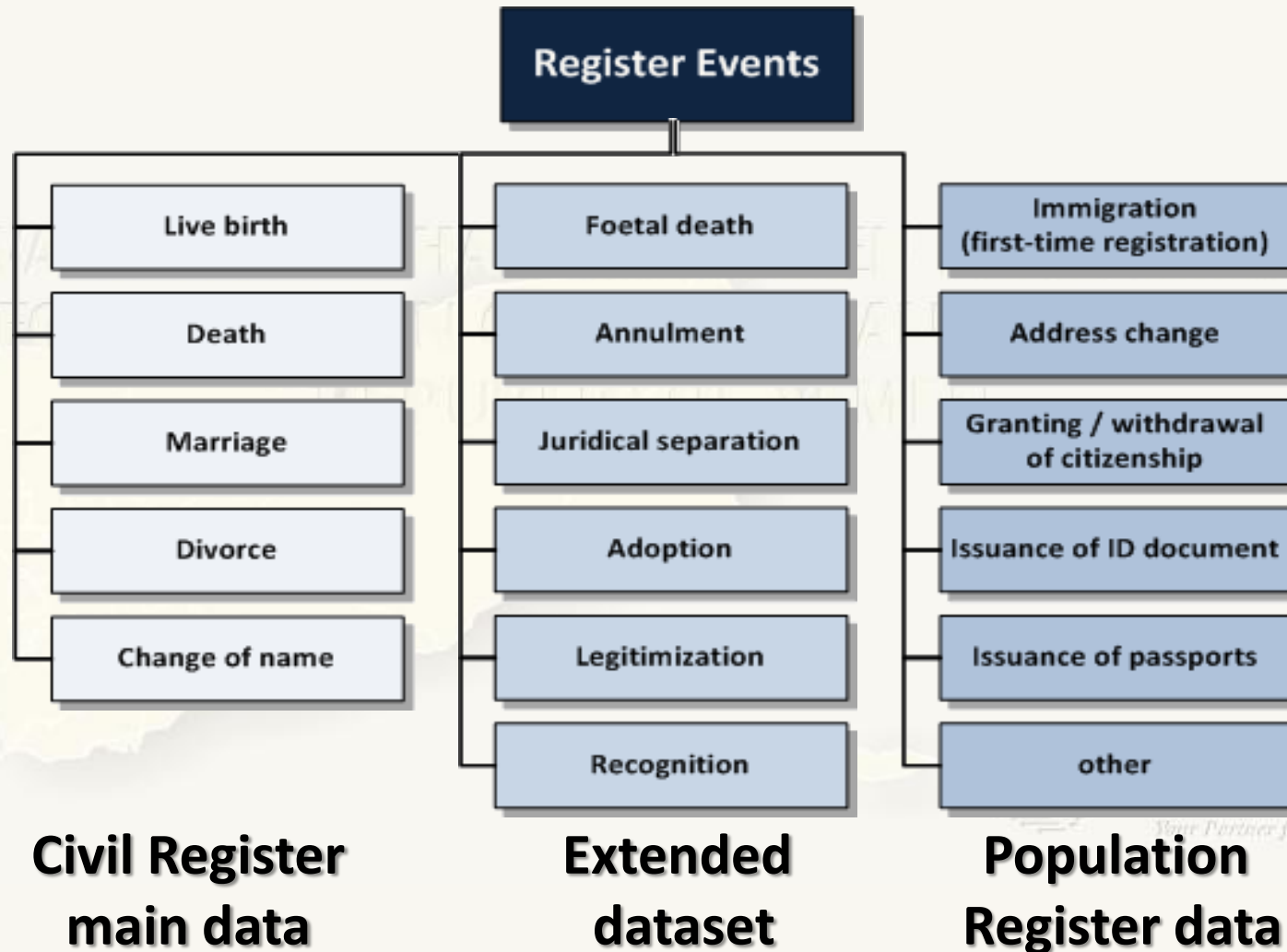
Based on Civil Register information but more information required

Sub-registration, especially in rural areas and gender related

Cooperation with other governmental institutions

Intention to join Civil and voter register in one unique register

Proposal for action-plan

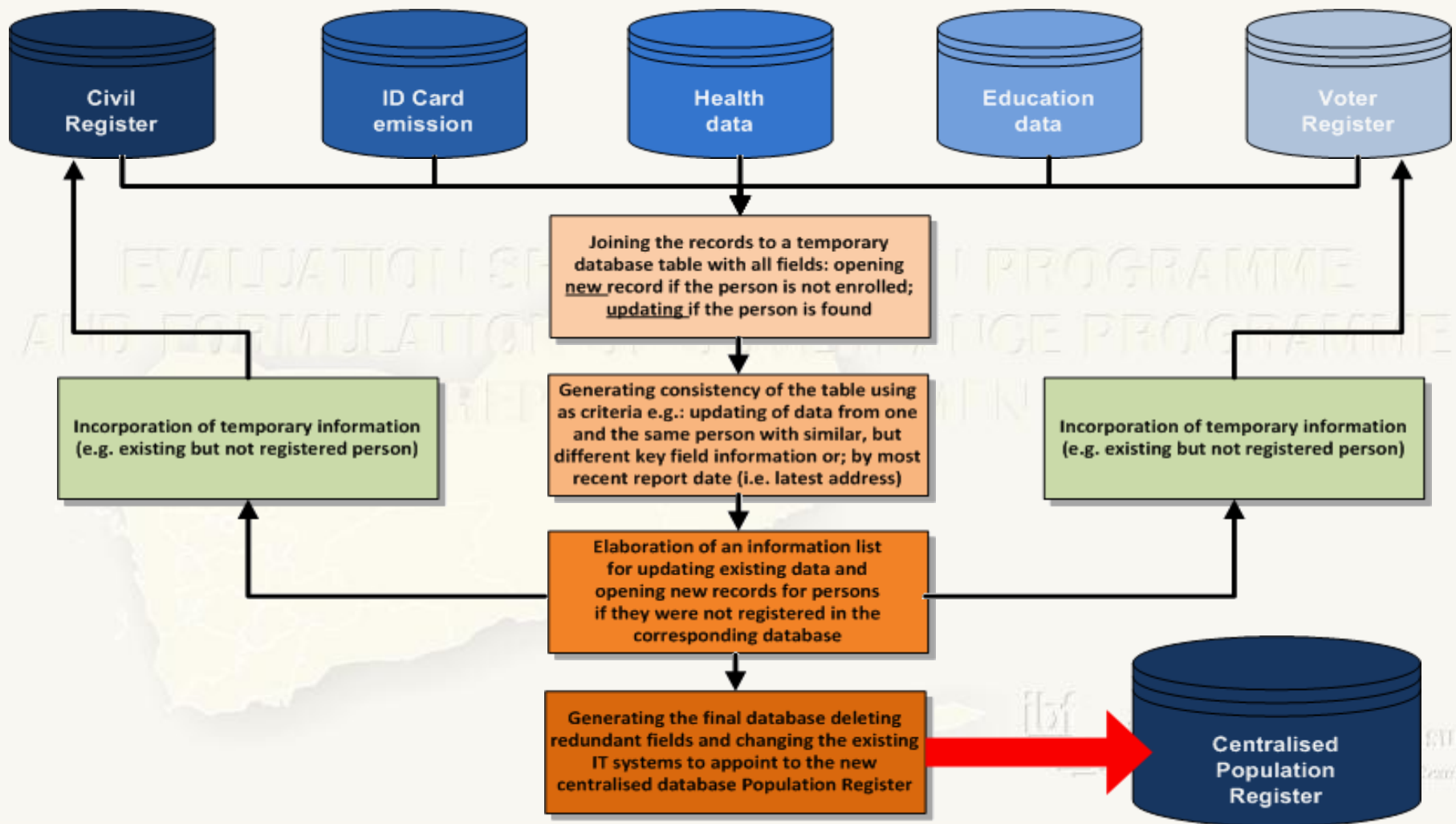
- **Coordinate efforts, focussing towards a National Population Database**
- **Including new technologies such as smart chip technology and biometrics**
- **Verifying backwards the registration issues and updating the corresponding registers**
- **Focussing on facilitating data-entry at local level for all the population**
- **Link between the governmental databases**



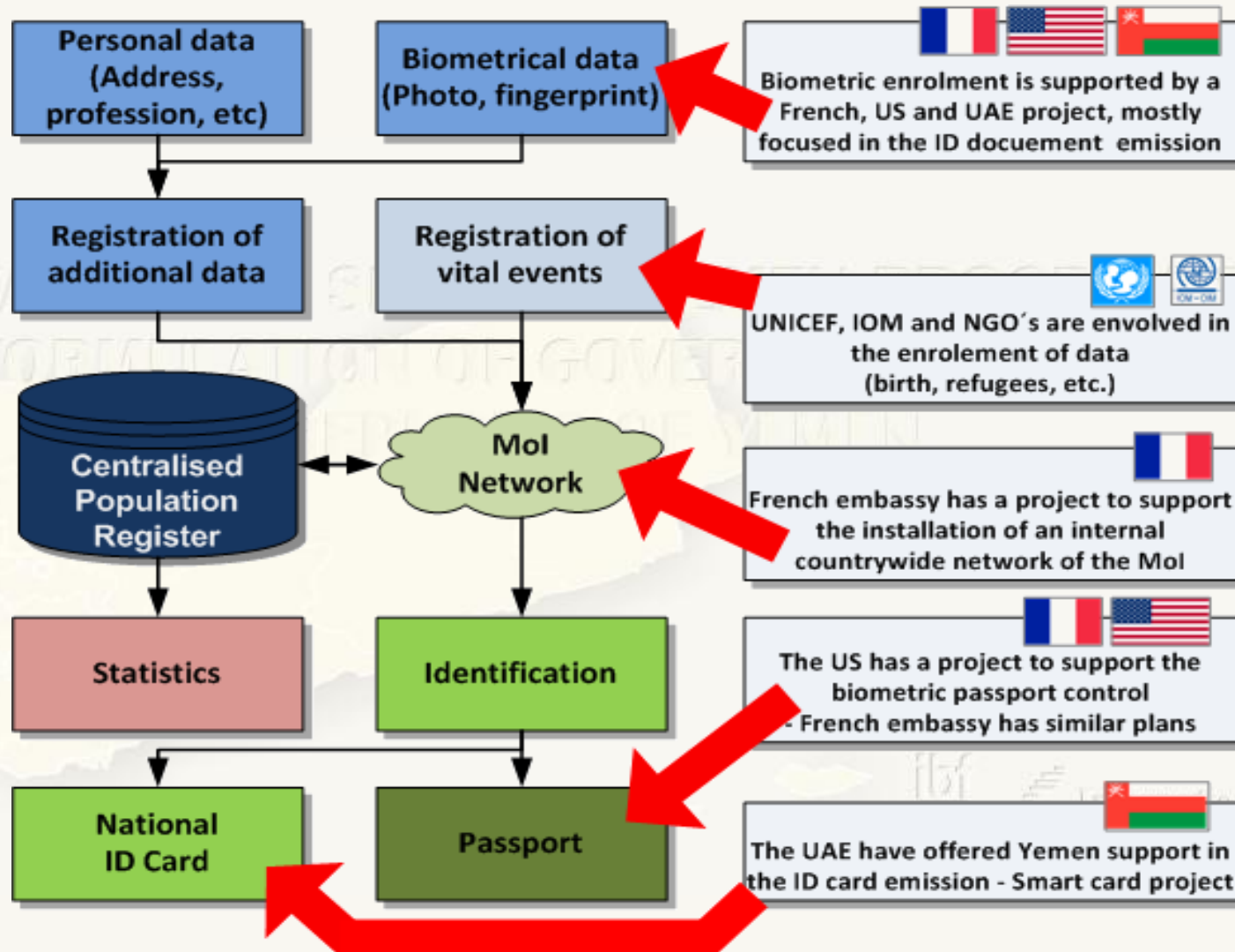

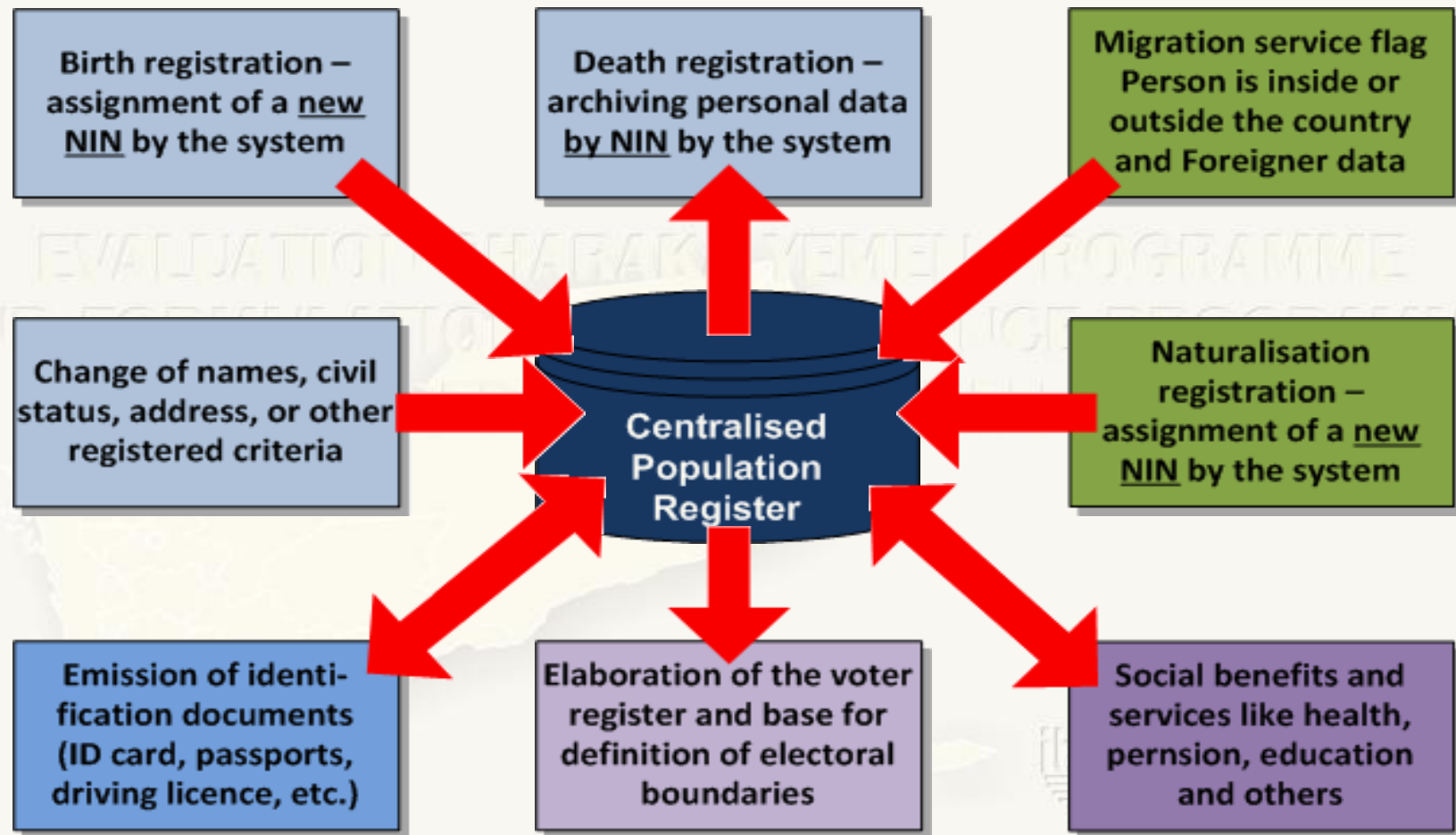

Direct activities

- Easy access to registration (location and modalities)
- Data-exchange between governmental institutions
- Changing budgeting for local areas gradually according to the registered number of residents
- Generating the legal need to be registered (legislation)

Indirect activities

- Campaigns for registration with CSOs and Mosques
- Awareness campaigns in schools and in media
